HOLIDAY LEARNING ACTIVITIES

Starting tomorrow, many of our students will progressively begin their long "summer" or End-of-Year holidays. It is a well-deserved break for our students that will give them time to bond with family and friends in a deep and meaningful way, and devote some time to their studies too.

As has been the practice in the recent years, we send home some light work that students can do during their free time. You will find the details explained below:

1. Baseline Phonics Reinforcement for Year1-Year 3 students (2018-2019)

The teaching of phonics skills is a common feature of the English curriculum for pupils and students in Reception and Years 1-3. In the UK, all Year 1 students undergo a statutory Phonics Screening Check to ascertain whether students have met the expected standard. At MIGS, we will conduct a Baseline Phonics Screening Check for students in Years 1, 2 and 3 at the start of next Academic Year.

Content of the Baseline Phonics Screening Check

Year 1	Phases 2 and 3	
Year 2	Phases 3, 4 and 5	
Year 3	Phases 5 and 6

We will provide you with further details just before the Baseline Phonics Screening Check in September 2018.

All you have to do is to spend at least 20 minutes two or three times weekly engaging in interactive activities together with your child, using the websites shown below:

You might need to select the Phase once again.

b) Phonics Bloom



You only need to work on the games and activities in the Phases that your child needs to work on, as shown in the Table above.

2. Journal Writing for Years 4-6 students (2018-2019)

Journal-writing can certainly help students polish their writing skills which will be essential for the rest of their years at School. Students would need an exercise book for this purpose. They can design a suitable cover for the book too. It is ideal if students could spend an hour daily to write down their thoughts about a variety of topics on one page and draw a picture or a diagram to illustrate their writing on the opposite page.
