The school also awarded certificates to students who achieved brilliance in sports outside of the school, along with the presentation of badges to student council members.


Additionally, we presented our donation of RM1,500 to the Make-A-Wish Malaysia foundation which we had collected during mufti day on World Smile Day.


It was a day of all-round appreciation for us in the Senior School.
