YEAR 3 EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO DEPARTMENT OF METEOROLOGY MALAYSIA

This Term, the Year Three students will be visiting the Department of Meteorology Malaysia at Petaling Jaya. This trip will extend their classroom learning experience and understanding of the weather conditions and needs of Malaysia, how the department works to help facilitate the public and how announcements are broadcast.

In Year Three, the students are learning about the *Weather Around the World*. They learn to identify countries according to its geographical locations: polar, hemispheres, equatorial region. Characteristics of hot and cold seasons. Students are also learning about the types of clouds, precipitation, wind direction and wind force. The students will learn about climate change, weather conditions up a mountain and the sea and understand the weather conditions of a place has an impact on people.

The trip shall give them an opportunity to:

- learn about the operations of cloud seeding
- get a closer insight at the various meteorological, climate & geophysical services provided by touring the weather operations and geophysics national centre
- be exposed to and get a real world experience at the Meteorology Broadcasting Studio
- reinforce their experiential and contextual learning
- · ask questions about real life experiences and record their learning
- know the impact of weather and climate on society
