#### JUNIOR SCHOOL UPDATES

#### Humanities Trail

This week, we extend our student's social studies skills with an educational trip or trails. Students will be exploring *connected learning* opportunities outside the classroom: participating in fieldwork investigations, landscape study, exploring and trying out our mapping skills.

### Year 1: Farm in the City

• An experience on the animal farm habitat, observing animal behaviour and exploring the geographical directions on the farm landscape, will be the main focus of the day.

## Year 2: Aquaria KLCC

• Exploring water animals from deep within the ocean, streams, coastal, forest and jungle water animals, including some very unique and wonderful examples.

## Year 3: Meteorological Department

 Our students are learning about the Weather from around the World, extending their understanding of the weather conditions and needs of Malaysia. They will also understand how the department works to help facilitate the public and how announcements are broadcast.

#### Year 4: Improving the Local Environment

 This school trail will help students to investigate and develop geographical inquiry and facilitate hands-on fieldwork investigation and explore ways to sustainably manage the school environment.

## Year 5: The Water Project

 Exploring local sources of water, its usage, investigating its system, understand the problem of water shortage locally and globally while generating ideas to conserve water in school/home.

Reception and Year 6 educational trails will take place at a later date.
