YEAR 6 HUMANITIES TRAIL – SUNGAI KEMENSAH

This Term, the Year Six students be visiting a river stream at Sungai Kemensah, behind the Zoo Negara locality, to extend their Social Studies classroom learning. This will help them to investigate and develop geographical enquiry and facilitate hands on learning experiences. They will collaborate in their year group and apply this awareness of their locality and extend it in term 3 from a global perspective - its pollution aspects and conservation.

In this trail, the students will be able to:

- investigate on important Malaysian rivers with special reference to Selangor (Kuala Lumpur) and rivers in the UK
- appreciate how rivers can change and affect the character of the surroundings
- investigate and explain the local river features that they observe (from a historical perspective as well)
- use confidently a full range of skills and different kinds of resources to undertake independent investigations on the river
- discuss ways to improve local environmental sustainability


