MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL - TERM 2 2019/2020

A warm welcome back to everyone and we have already started the year with a smooth transition. I begin with a quotation from Carl Bard, an American writer and editor, probably best known for his poetry and a winner of two Pulitzer Prizes, most notably for his biography of Abraham Lincoln.

The pace of engagement really does continue here at MIGS, I must take this opportunity to thank parents who were able to join me in the very first week of term, discussing our preparations for CAIE Checkpoint Assessments in April of this year. I can confirm the assessments will take place for both Year 6 and Year 9 during the week beginning Monday the 20th of April 2020. Further details will be sent to parents soon.

The first week also involved our Year 6 Mathematicians engaged in a competition organised by the AIMS group and hosted by the Alice Smith School. Two days of fairly intense competition that our students thoroughly enjoyed and received an interesting Tee Shirt crafted from 100% recycled plastic. Thank you to Ms Sharon for leading the team.

Chinese New Year approaches rapidly and I can already see the influence with many appealing decorations in our corridors. The School break will be in late January with the school closing from the 24th of January until the 28th of January and reopen on Wednesday 29th of January. Our Lion Dance celebration and blessing is scheduled for the morning of the 7th of February.

I am also pleased to share some news for our *Early Years Section* which we are very excited to launch following Chinese New Year, a more detailed letter and information will be available soon. Please also keep a look out for our new *Scholarship Program* that will launch shortly. Focused initially for students who are currently in Year 6 (for academic intake in September 2020 into Year 7), students who are currently in Year 9 (for academic intake in September 2020 into Year 10) and finally for students currently in Year 11 for access into our planned *A level Programme*. The application, eligibility and selection/assessment process will be published very soon.

Following a thorough review of a successful first term allow me to share some updates and amendments. During the reflection process, I believe it is always important to ask he not simply "Whether to change?" but rather "When to change?" as we strive to continually progress.

JUNIOR SCHOOL UPDATES

Next week sees the start of our CCA programme with a range of activities that students will take part in from sewing to cricket. The activities will run for three weeks and then all the years will come together for house sports in week 4 and then the activities will continue for an additional three weeks. The rotation will then repeat, Mr Charlie and the CCA team will send out a letter with further details shortly.

In the Junior school the CCA programme will continue to be completed in the morning sessions when the weather is more comfortable and it also allows effective sharing of facilities with the Senior school. However; Thursday is a relatively long day for the Junior school and we have some tired students during the last period of the day. To gain more exposure (to our often more beneficial learning times) the last period will move to become period 2, rotating into the morning session. *The day will now end at 15:30*. Scientific Enquiry
