## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL - END OF TERM 3 UPDATES

It has been a positive week here at the school, our social distancing procedures have moved from the planning phase and now become a tried and tested method. Re-engaging with colleagues has been beneficial as we continue to review plans for the end of the term and school year.

This rotational system for staff will continue in theory until the end of the academic year, unless directives from the MOE and MOH allow increased access to the campus.

In my most recent update I mentioned the potential return to the school campus for students following IGCSE courses in Year 10. This remains firmly in my plans for the 24<sup>th</sup> of June. Parents of our Year 10 students, please refer to the information in a separate email, where clear Social Distancing, specific break time directives, and other restrictions will be shared.

Speaking with fellow Principal's, many have recently had visits from the MOE to check the operating procedures in place. It has certainly been reassuring to hear that our systems are certainly in line with expectations and allow me to thank our Head of Operations, Administrative and support staff for their continued efforts during this new era.

#### Learning

We continue to utilize our current remote learning provision completing the usual timetable structure for the following year groups :

Reception students
All Junior School students
Key stage 3 students (Years 7,8&9)

The Senior school students will shortly be directed to a revised google site as the amount of work posted and retrieved is rapidly compromising the stability of the current site.

#### Assessments, examinations and reports

As mentioned previously our assessments for Term 3 will be based on the work completed via our remote learning platform, with the exception of Year 10 who may have time to consolidate their grades with some assessments taking place on campus towards the end of July.
