We are celebrating our own MIGS Environment Day on the 25th November, 2022.

Our Junior school students have been briefed about Environment Day during last week's Monday assembly, and are eagerly looking forward to this event. The theme for this year is 'Malaysia's Endangered Flora and Fauna.' We teachers have been working with them in their classes and in between classes on various activities planned for the day, each Year Group has been allocated a topic. On Friday - 25th of November, we will be having an exhibition of their work, including PPT presentations, posters, charts, short role plays, songs, etc. Students will also be able to visit each other's classrooms in order to learn more about our endangered flora and fauna.

The topics for each year group are as follows:

- Early Years: Butterfly Malaysian tree nymph
- Year 1: Leatherback Turtle
- Year 2: Hawksbill Turtle
- Year 3: Bornean Orangutan / Black Shrew
- Year 4: Rhinoceros Hornbill / Malayan Tiger
- Year 5: Sun Bear / Borneo Pygmy Elephant
- Year 6: Flora Rafflesia / Pitcher Plant (Nepenthes Rajah)

On that day, students are encouraged to wear a costume or come dressed with something related to the environment, i.e. Mother Earth; flora and/or fauna; costumes using recycled materials; or costumes with messages related to our environment, e.g. Save our Earth, Save the Tigers, etc.
